It is not yet clear where our Community Recovery Plan or the Lyttelton Masterplan will sit within the Recovery Strategy for Greater Christchurch currently being prepared by CERA. When we know more we will let you know.

## Lyttelton Masterplan Update

By the time you read this, Council staff and consultants working on the Lyttelton Masterplan will be considering community feedback on the first draft of the Lyttelton Masterplan. They will use this feedback to continue refining the proposals to better fit the needs of the community. It is hoped the official draft will be ready for approval by the Mayor and Councillors in September, following which you will be able to make formal submissions.
